NATIVE BUTTERFLY SPECIES

Various species have been spotted on the Follingsby Max site including the Painted Lady being one of the most popular species.

BIRD WATCHING

A huge variety of birds have been identified in the conservation zone including: Grey Heron, Sandpiper, Ringed Plover, Herring Gull, Greater Black Back Gull, Carrion Crow, Jackdaw, Magpie, Linnet, Swallow, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Chaffinch, Grey Tit, Willow Warbler, Reed Bunting, Robin, Dunnock, Wood Pigeon, Pheasant and sighting of a Buzzard flying over the site.

AMPHIBIANS & MAMMALS

The Common Toad was spotted hopping along the site along with evidence of Foxes, Hares and Bank Voles.
